## Tuition Payment Plans

Take advantage of these convenient payment plans by using the e-Cashier option on the Method of Payment screen as you complete course registration on the Class Browser.

- No interest is charged
- \$25.00 enrollment fee per semester (not per course)
- Payment is by automatic bank draft (ACH) or automatic Credit/Debit card charge

**Four Payment Plan:** Register for courses and set up a payment plan by **January 3**. Payments will be debited January through April, on the 5th of each month.

**Three Payment Plan:** Register for courses and set up a payment plan by **January 24**. Requires a 25% down payment. Remaining charges will be debited February through April, on the 5th of each month, until the balance is paid.

**Two Payment Plan:** Register for courses and set up a payment plan by **February 21**. Requires a 50% down payment. Remaining charges will be debited March and April, on the 5th of each month, until the balance is paid.
